BREASTFEEDING IN WIC

Oregon WIC breastfeeding initiation rates increased by 67 percent between 2000 and 2022.

Among WIC infants who initiated breastfeeding in Oregon in 2022, **34 percent** continued breastfeeding at 6 months.



Fruit and Vegetable Benefit: Congress enhanced WIC's fruit and vegetable benefit to align with scientific recommendations. Current monthly benefit amounts are \$26 for children, \$47 for pregnant and postpartum participants, and \$52 for breastfeeding participants. In FY 2023, WIC provided an estimated \$22.9M in fruit and vegetable benefits to **62,645** participants in Oregon.
