#### **BREASTFEEDING IN WIC**

In 2022, 81 percent of 6- to 13-month-old infants and children in Washington initiated breastfeeding.

Among WIC infants who initiated breastfeeding in Washington in 2022, 29 percent continued breastfeeding at 6 months.



Fruit and Vegetable Benefit: Congress enhanced WIC's fruit and vegetable benefit to align with scientific recommendations. Current monthly benefit amounts are \$26 for children, \$47 for pregnant and postpartum participants, and \$52 for breastfeeding participants. In FY 2023, WIC provided an estimated \$37.7M in fruit and vegetable benefits to 102,474 participants in Washington.
